# **LEVELS OF CONCERN**

### **COYOTE BEHAVIOR**

Rarely or occasionally seen at night, more rarely during dusk and dawn.

Occasionally seen during the day.

Frequently seen at night.

Free-ranging pets occasionally
disappear.

Frequently seen during the day. Stalking or attacking pets. Fleeing from people.

Approaching people aggressively.
Growling, barking when hazed
(instead of running away).
Following people or children.
Preying on pets in yards.

- 1. DO NOT feed coyotes.
- 2. DO NOT let your pets run loose.
- 3. DO NOT run from a coyote.
- 4. USE repellents or fencing if needed.
- **5. REPORT** aggressive, fearless coyotes immediately to Mobile 311.
